Supply List

- Plein air setup (easel/pochade/tripod/lap setup)
 - You can see what I use here https://www.juddmercer.art/materials but please don't overinvest! You just need something portable and comfortable enough to make it through the day. We will have options to avoid walking too far but I would still recommend scaling down to what can fit into a backpack or a few totes.
 - Other plein air suggestions:
 - Portable chair (Optional, only if you are more comfortable with one)
 - Hat for the sun (ideally not brightly colored)
 - Good walking/standing shoes
 - Layers (can be windy/chilly near the water)
 - Papertowels or rags and a few trashbags
- Water media sketchbook and pad such as a <u>Strathmore Mixed Media</u> or <u>Moleskine Watercolor Sketchbook</u> or a <u>Ringed Sketchbook</u>. Toned tan/gray paper is optional, but definitely bring white. If you prefer, you can also bring illustration board panels cut down to a manageable size (8x10, 6x8, 5x7). I would *not* recommend watercolor paper because it can be too absorbent and eat up a ton of paint. A sketchbook *and* a pad would be ideal—we'll be doing studies and more "formal" small works and it's nice to have both.
- Watercolor or portable palette. Something small with 8-10 wells and some good mixing surface area. I would not recommend the cheap "flower" looking palettes, the mixing areas are far too small.
- Air-tight paint box like this one (optional)
- Masking tape
- Small mister spray bottle < very important outside!
- Gouache
 - Student grade is ok for this class, I prefer Holbein but any brand will do.
 This 12-paint kit is probably the best bet for students who want the basics with little investment and is perfectly fine for the class:

Brushes

- o Go for something synthetic. Cheap is ok! I use Princeton Aqua Elites
- Square/Flat/Brights (1", 3/4", 1/4" these will be my primary brushes)
- o Rounds (A good mix of sizes 8-2)
- Rigger/liner brush (optional)
- Water container
- Graphite pencils, eraser
- Red-orange colored pencil (optional)
